

- per month purchases first aid and sudden infant death prevention training for a teen mother (Black United Fund of Wisconsin); provides about 25 cups of powdered milk for children in Malawi (Neighbor To Nation); buys two prostrate screenings at Prevent Cancer State Fair free health screening booths (America's Charities).
- per month supplies critical pre- and post-natal care for 10 mothers and newborns in Afghanistan (Global Impact); adopts an acre in the Northern Rockies and creates a network of wildlife corridors connecting large tracts of land (EarthShare).
- per month provides milk for six children while eating a meal (Hunger Relief Fund administered by Hunger Task Force, Inc.); covers the cost of one blood test or ensures coverage for five doctor co-pays, allowing those suffering to receive medical attention (Neighbor To Nation); provides education materials on liver wellness and interactive activity materials for two classroom-based Love Your Liver education programs for elementary and high school students (Community Health Charities of Wisconsin).
- \$10

 per month provides hands-on solar education lessons for two Wisconsin high school classes (Wisconsin Environmental Education Foundation); pays for training a local animal shelter worker to rescue and care for animals in their community during a natural disaster (Independent Charities of America); supplies water filtration units to 10 families in Indonesia, providing them with clean safe drinking water (Global Impact); supplies a year of basic mental health services for 12 hungry or homeless people (Hunger Relief Fund administered by Hunger Task Force, Inc.); buys enough plastic pipette tips to conduct nearly 5,000 tests to find compounds to prevent proteins that play a part in forming the plaque associated with Alzheimer's (America's Charities).
- \$12 per month covers the cost of an experienced community organizer to help groups reduce, eliminate, clean up or prevent chemical contamination that threatens their community's health (EarthShare); provides a classroom of school kids with a healthy farm-fresh snack (Community Shares).
- \$16 per month feeds a family of 4 for an entire month (Community Shares); buys a sheet of bus passes for 10 trips that include medical and employment services (Black United Fund of Wisconsin).
- \$20 per month helps to support staff at a Cystic Fibrosis care center for patients (Community Health Charities of Wisconsin); covers the cost of one education and outreach intern part-time for one week at the Necedah National Wildlife Refuge in western Wisconsin (Wisconsin Environmental Education Foundation); helps 600 people receive a therapeutic visit from a therapy animal (Independent Charities of America).



Follow steps 1-7 to complete the pledge form and return it to your payroll office. (Keep the pink copy of your completed pledge form for tax purposes.)

- 1. Legibly print your name, employee ID and department in the space provided. (If you do not have an employee ID, use the last 4 digits of your SSN)
- 2. Indicate the amount and method of giving.
 - Payroll contribution (January December, minimum \$1.00 per pay period)
 - · Check or cash
 - · Any combination of these
- 3. Specify the amount and recipients.
 - To the charity of your choice (see charity and federation numbers in the brochure)
 - To be shared by all federations and their charities
- 4. Be sure your Total Donation in Part 2 on the pledge form equals your designations in Part 1.
- 5. Sign and date the pledge form.
- **6.** Tell us if you want an acknowledgement of your gift. If you do, please print your address clearly.
- 7. Please deliver the white and yellow copies of your pledge form to your payroll contact person by mail or in person.

Can I determine who receives my gift?

Yes. Just indicate your choice of federations and/or charities on the pledge form. Only the groups you choose will receive your money.

Is my gift tax deductible?

Yes. Yes, as allowed by law. Only umbrella groups and charities that qualify for federal tax-exempt status may participate in the campaign. Please note: The Pension Protection Act of 2006 now requires taxpayers who claim deductions for charitable donations to provide proof of all contributions should they be audited. Be sure to keep a copy of your pledge form for tax purposes. In addition, if you choose payroll contribution, keep copies of all pay stubs and/or other documents from your employer that indicate the amounts you have given to charities. If you contribute by cash or check, keep all receipts, canceled checks, and/or bank statements that verify the amounts and recipients of your contributions. (The campaign will mail official receipts for cash and check gifts of \$250 or more. Receipts for gifts of less than \$250 are available upon request.) If you have any questions about tax deductions for charitable gifts, consult a tax professional.
