Glenn

Glenn, 58, was injured at work two years ago and currently receives disability benefits. He wishes he could go back to work to earn more money but his injuries are too severe and permanent. He and his 15-year old son live together at home. "He grows so fast and eats so much," said Glenn. "But the money is never enough to feed us both." To make ends meet, Glenn visits Central City Churches food pantry once a month.

The food that Glenn and his son receive from Central City makes a huge difference every month. "We can have meals three times a day and keep up with the rent for our apartment," he said. "It's a small place, but it's home...I was worried that my son and I would end up in some roachinfested place, but the food we receive from the pantry helps us keep what we have."
